SPECIAL FOR INTERNET USERS!

So many newspapers and newsletters are using on-line editions, not only to duplicate what is in the printed versions, but to add "something extra" for Internet users. A bit of Rosary history: Do you recognize this house from 1898? (Probably Norbert was the only one around Rosary at that time!!???)



CHARLES L. COFFIN,
DETROIT,

Charles L. Coffin of Detroit was awarded U.S. Patent 428,459 for an arc welding process using a metal electrode. This was the first time that metal melted from the electrode carried across the arc to deposit filler metal in the joint to make a weld.

Notice the farm-type homes in the background. Probably the house on the far right side, behind the tree, is the Barnes family home where Rosary started in 1889. The church, at the time of this drawing would be off the drawing to the right. On the far left you see a little of what we now call the chapel, at that time St. Joseph's Episcopal Church. And....is that the same tree that is there today?

And here the house is today:
