HEAD START

The Order of the Fishermen Ministry has run a free Head Start program since 1994, part of the federally funded Head Start Program. As many community services are being cut back, this program is still going strong. The program does have income eligibility. Students may be between 3 and 5, residents of Mid-City zip codes: 48202, 48204, 48206, 28210, 48211 and 48238. Registration takes place at three locations: St. John, 4950 Oakman Blvd (Mon.- Thurs., 9 AM – 3 PM), Joy Head Start Center 10047 Grand River (Mon. – Thurs. 9 -3, Friday 8 – 11 AM) and Tabernacle Head Start Center, 2080 West Grand Boulevard (Mon. – Thurs., 9 – 3). Verification of birth, address and income, current physical/dental reports and parent and child's Social Security Cards will be needed to register. Spread the word to your friends and neighbors. This is an excellent program.
