Our own country was for years “mission territory.” (A Rosary note: Our first Pastor, Father Van Antwerp [1889 – 1930] in the earliest days of Rosary put the letters S. M. after his signature, standing for the Latin words meaning Missionary Priest. So, we have direct evidence that Rosary was mission territory!) Missionaries not only spread the Faith, they serve as teachers, medical personnel, social workers, even in many cases construction workers and engineers. Their work goes on day after day. How often do we think of missionaries? Next weekend will have the opportunity to pray for the success of missionaries, and also to donate to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, the society in charge of mission activity around the world. Even in these difficult economic times, we must remember there are those worse off than we are. Envelopes are available this weekend. Please spend a few minutes this week reflecting on the work done by the men and women missionaries, and be generous.

THE YEAR OF FAITH

Pope Benedict XVI has designated that a Year of Faith be celebrated, beginning October 11, 2012—the 50th anniversary of the start of the Second Vatican Council. From time to time throughout history, the Church has used Years of Faith as opportunities for the faithful to re-dedicate themselves to the Faith and to deepen their understanding of the Faith. This is a time for “conversion,” a turning back to Jesus and an entering into a deeper relationship with Him. This year, we will be hearing a lot about the New Evangelization, a call to deepen our Faith and to share it with others. We are called on to reflect on our baptism and how it changed our lives.
