Two weeks ago, thousands of people came into our neighborhood for DElecticity, a display where all kinds of light shows featured various buildings stretching for blocks. People lingered in the neighborhood until almost midnight, even as it showered and the temperature dropped!



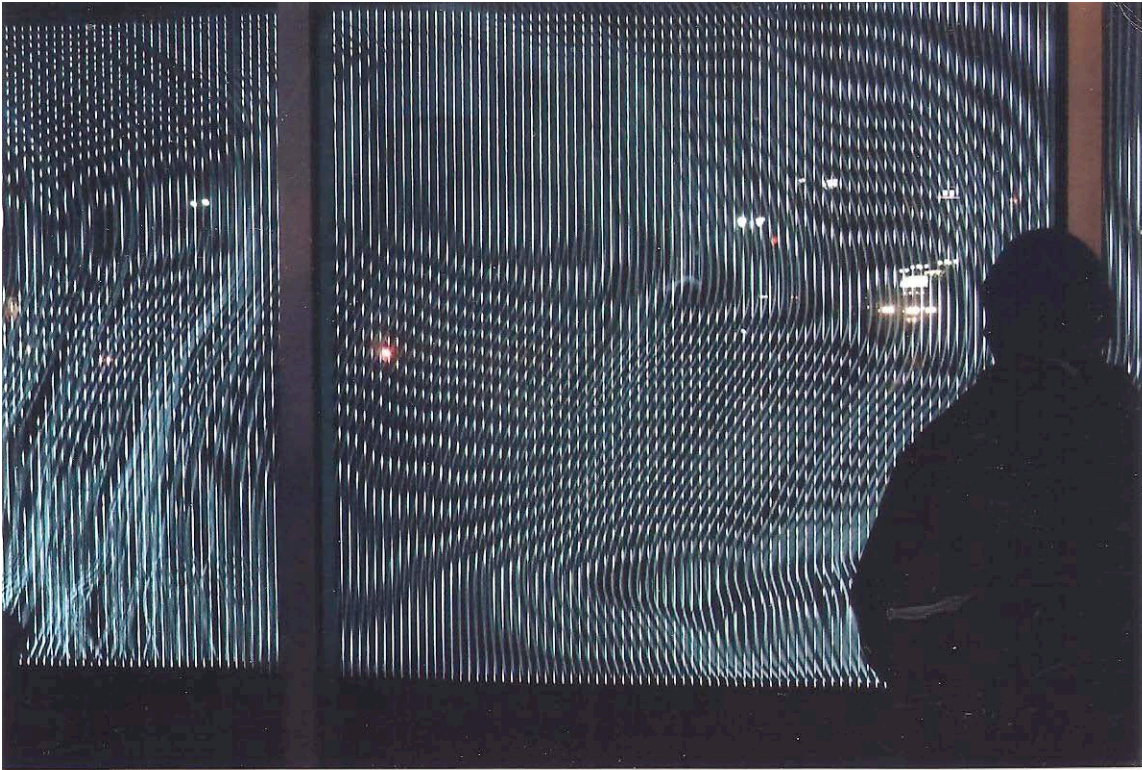
The Main Library had projections on the exterior which looked like a battle from ancient times was taking place. The building also appeared to fold up, fall in, and reappear.



The parade of hundreds of illuminated bicycles was so long it took almost fifteen minutes to pass by a spot. This is one group of riders taking a breather, on their bikes carrying illuminated letters spelling out messages about Detroit.

On the other side of Rosary, where the old American Beauty Iron Factory used to be, the land has been quickly and very efficiently cleared. This last Thursday Wayne State broke ground for the 93 million dollar biomedical research building. The old building in the rear of the photo is the back of the former Dagleish Cadillac dealership, designed by the famous architect Albert Kahn. This building will be incorporated into the new building which will fill the entire block.
