FRIENDS OF THE POOR WALK

For the last several years, the St. Vincent de Paul Society has had a very unique fundraiser—the Walk with the Poor. The idea is that we demonstrate our concern for the poor and homeless of our City by walking to raise money for projects that assist them. Either contribute as you register, or develop a list of “sponsors” who will contribute to your walk. This year's walk is next Saturday, September 29. The walk begins at Milliken State Park, on 1900 Atwater Street just east of the Renaissance Center, then continues the Dequindre Cut Greenway, a beautifully rebuilt section of old railroad tracts. Registration begins at 9 AM, although you can pre-register on-line. The actual walk starts officially at 10—although you are free to start any time. You do not have to walk the entire 3.5 miles. “Walk” includes run, skate, bicycle, wheelchair, etc. Every walker will get a T-Shirt, goodie bag, refreshments, etc. If you are unable to take part in the walk, your donations for the St. Vincent de Paul Society can be given to Sister Catharina or Norbert.

There was enough food for hundreds of guests! Mike Dean is in the background—he hasn't spotted the food yet!



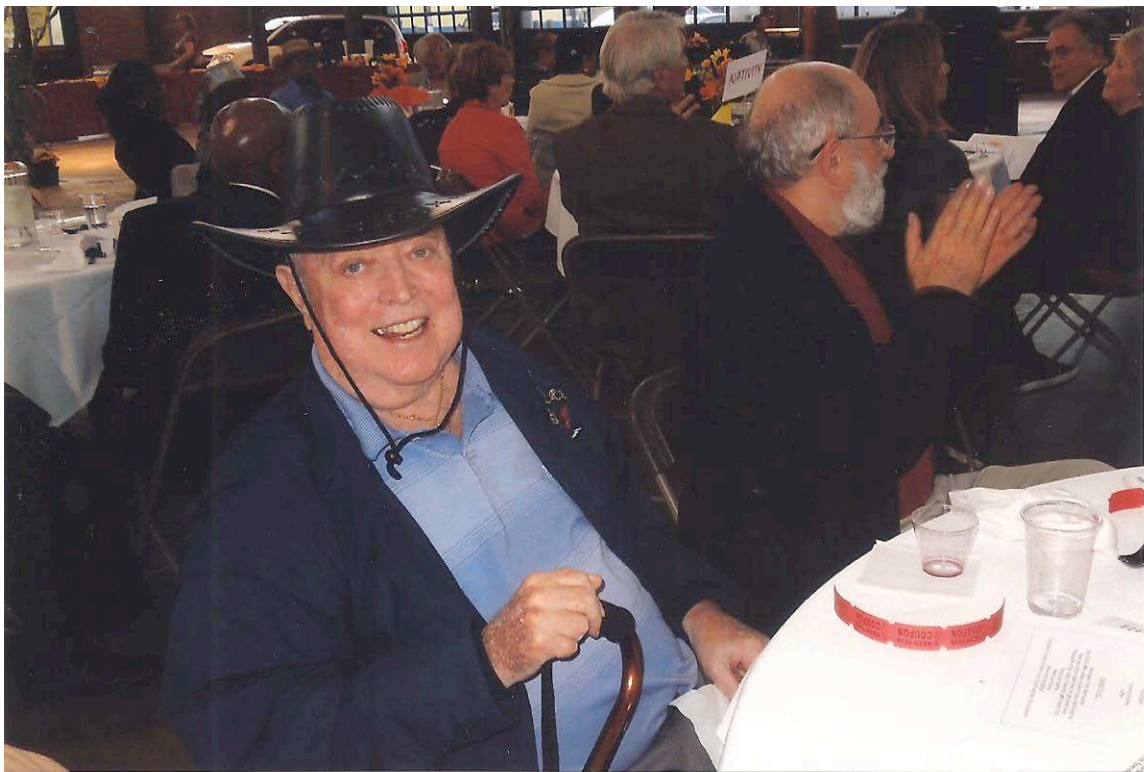

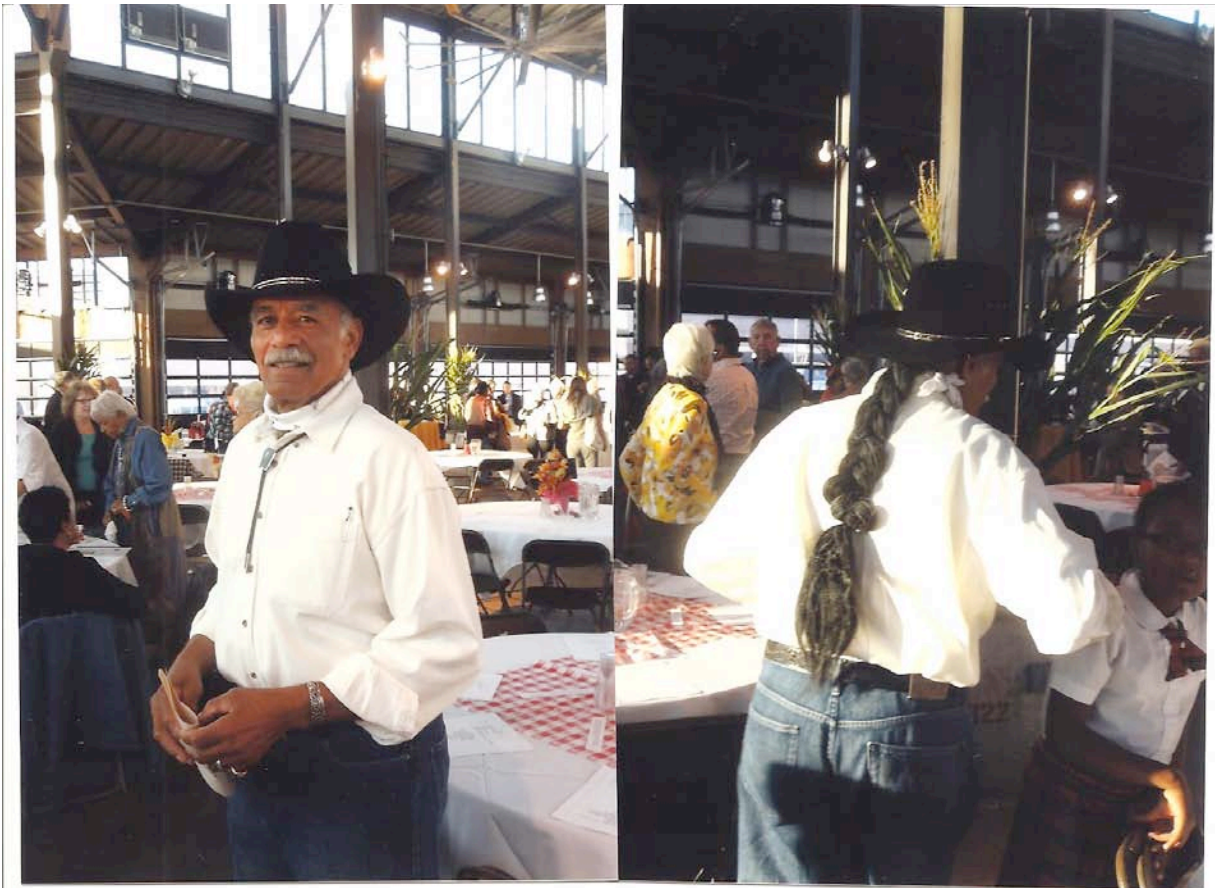
