Sr. Kate received her doctorate in Canon Law from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, Italy. She also has a BA in education, and an MA in theology. She comes with a background as a former diocesan tribunal lawyer, teacher, parish catechetical director, and diocesan director of religious education. She is a writer for the catechetical program, "Seasons of Faith" and is published in Italy, England, Germany, and the United States. Sr. Kate recently moved to Rhode Island where she has opened a private practice. Her focus will be working for the rights of laity and their role in the Catholic Church.

As of December, 2012, Sr. Kate has helped Catholics from 28 U.S. parishes in six dioceses who were either closed or threatened with closing to win their appeals, including thirteen in Cleveland, OH; nine in Allentown, PA; four in Springfield, MA; and one each in Camden, NJ, Buffalo NY, Kansas City, KS and Grand Rapids, MI.

Sr. Kate will also be available after her presentation to speak with parishes that may be interested in using her services.

80 Years Ago---1933



How many “different” things can you spot? Obviously the statue is NOT on the platform above the roof—that happened in 1937. And the lights are on extensions aimed at the statue. Over the front door the name of the church is

displayed. Above the name, in the little alcove still visible is, if memory serves me right, a permanent Nativity scene. This was in place into the early 1960s. Notice the hedge circling the building and the flower planters along the curbs. This grassy area was lost when Woodward was widened in the mid-1030s. You can see street car tracks in the pavement---and one of those famous Detroit potholes! If you look very closely at the large windows of the church on the Medbury Avenue (not Edsel Ford yet—that came around 1956) you might notice that the extension of the wall-line under the windows, caused by the addition of confessionals, was not in place. Now...is that a police officer or a streetcar conductor at the crossing? He's probably watching that car entering the intersection which probably isn't able to do much speeding!
