DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING HOLIDAY

Monday, January 21, is the annual celebration of Dr. King's life and legacy. It is also the date of the second inauguration of President Obama. In the spirit of the day, we are all asked to reach out, in some way, to help others in our family, our church, our community. Think about ways you could make a difference—if only for one day. There is the annual Mass at the Cathedral at 10 AM. The annual Rally and March for Jobs, Peace and Justice will begin at noon, inside Central Methodist Church at Woodward and Adams, by Grand Circus Park. Dr. King was a frequent visitor to this church. It is hoped there will be a good turnout, especially since 2013 is the 50th anniversary of Dr. King's "Great March to Freedom" down Woodward Avenue, June 23, 1963. At 5 PM, the Detroit Catholic Pastoral Alliance urges us to join others protesting the sale of the former St. Bede property to WalMart. WalMart has a history of insensitive labor practices and of using "sweatshops" to produce their merchandise. The protest, which certainly is in line with Dr. King's philosophy, will be at Southfield Road and 12 Mile, St. Bede's property.

CANON LAW AND CHURCH CLOSINGS

Detroit churches will have a very special opportunity to hear from Sister Kate Kuenstler, a canon lawyer, whose work focuses on the rights of the laity and their role in the Catholic Church. So far, she has helped Catholics in 28 parishes around the country win appeals to the closing of these parishes. Sister will be in Detroit at the invitation of the Alliance on Saturday, February 9, from 1 – 2:30 at the Sacred Heart Church Activities Building. Her information will certainly be important for Rosary. Hopefully, we will get some new ideas and strategies to help our survival. Let's have a good turnout at this free presentation.

DETROIT DREAMING FILM FESTIVAL

Matrix Theater Company is presenting its first film festival, a series of Detroit-based documentaries, live shorts, etc., all having to do with Detroit and the people who live, work or play here. FINANCIAL NEWS

The Rosary Finance Committee met Monday to review our situation and progress. As shown below, more people are using envelopes, although contributions are slipping down from our basic weekly goal to meet our budget. We need to watch this carefully. Winter bills are just beginning to come in! Also, the Finance Committee touched on the situation involving people approaching parishioners for change—inside and outside the church. We should without a doubt make it clear that we come here to worship and should not face requests for money while we worship. The City has a policy that if a person says NO to a request for money, that should end the conversation. There should be no continuing requests, etc. Rosary, through the generosity of several parishioners, provides 35-40 sandwiches each Sunday for people needing lunch. While some Rosary members might wish to give spare change to those who request some, please understand that your actions might be misunderstood by others who are watching, and encourage others to ask. It would be best, if you choose to do this, that the transactions take place outside church—and certainly not during Mass.

For the weekend of January 13, 53 envelopes were used, the highest number in over a year. The collection totaled \$1751, less than our goal of \$1923.

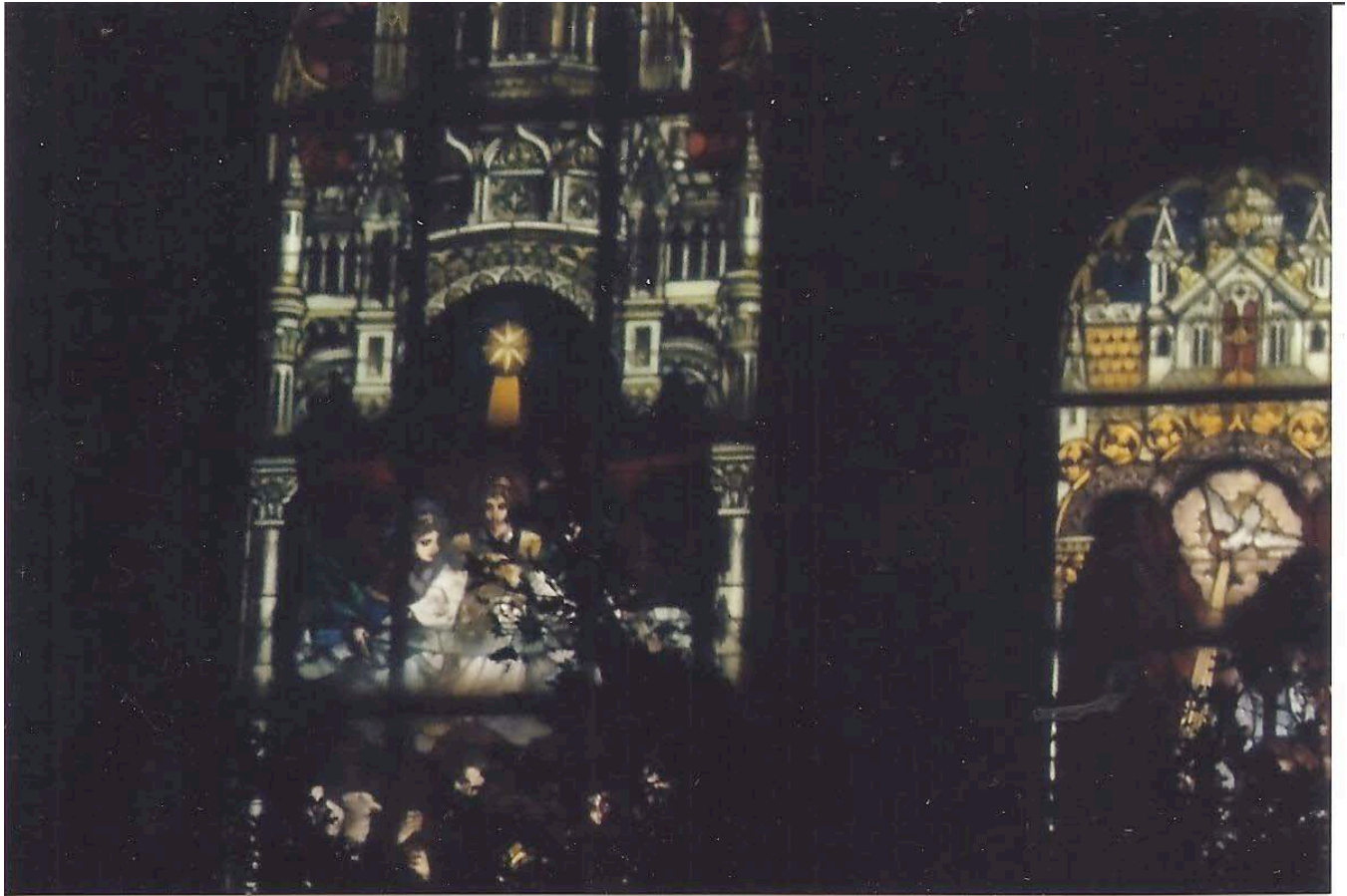
DRIVER'S LICENSES FOR IMMIGRANTS

The new higher-power light bulbs in the church give our windows a different appearance as seen from the street.

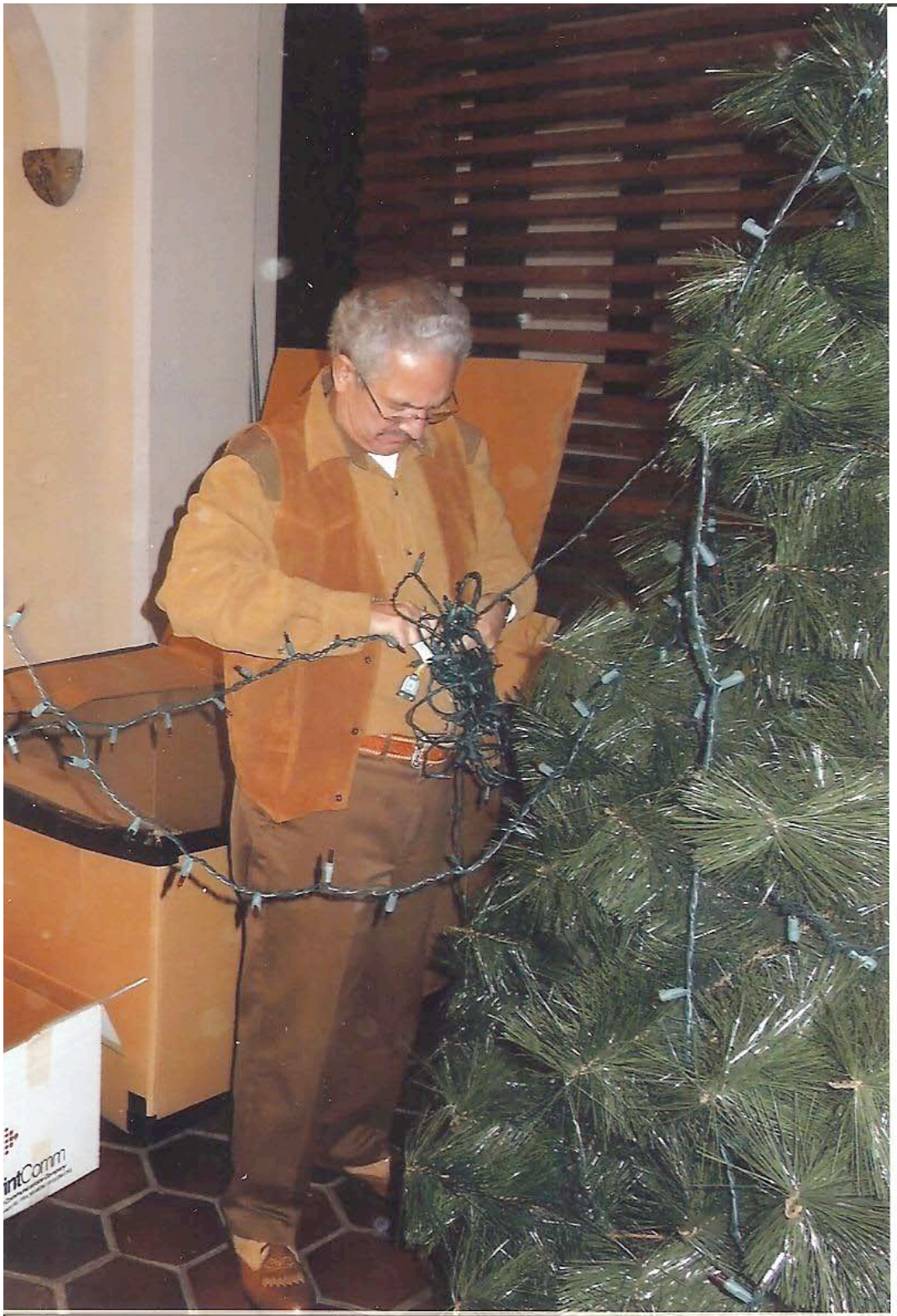
The Christmas Decorations Come Down
