ROSARY FINANCES

Last weekend, 43 Offertory envelopes were used. The collection totaled \$ 1988. As reported, our new budget for 2013-2014 calls for Offertory collections to total \$110,000 for the year. This translates roughly into about \$2200 per week. So...for the first two weeks into new fiscal year, we are roughly \$850 below our goal. Of course, people are on vacation and the rainy/hot weather might have kept some people home. And...we KNOW they will make up for a missing week when they return. Let's stay focused on our very necessary goal.

TOGETHER IN FAITH

Each week lately, we have been reporting discussions and progress as we explore the proposed merger with St. Aloysius and St. Patrick. It is absolutely necessary that all Rosary members know what is going on. While a small committee has been given the task of starting these discussions, eventually ALL Rosary members will have to meet and feel that they are comfortable with any merger that is arranged. In that way, these weekly reports are intended to keep everyone informed and focused on the task we must face. Last Monday, the committee met with Fr. Loren, Administrator of St. Patrick and St. Aloysius, and Mr. James from the Archdiocesan Office of Parish Life. Again, Fr. Loren made it clear that if Rosary wants this merger, we would be most welcome. The other two parishes have done a lot of background work for their merger, which has not taken place yet. Rosary has to be brought “up to speed.” Just agreeing in principle to the merger is just the beginning. Right now Rosary is involved in getting to know more about the other two parishes, and they are finding out about us. Last week, for example, we shared the Mission Statements in an attempt to open awareness and discussion about our similarities and differences. Next Sunday, our parish picnic will give everyone an opportunity to ask about and respond to questions dealing with life at Rosary. Fr. Loren has expressed an interest in celebrating Mass here some Sunday.
