CHANGING LIVES TOGETHER

After weeks of preparation, the Changing Lives Together (CLT) campaign gets under way this weekend. As you have heard, Rosary like all parishes in the diocese has been given a three-year target based on our record of Offertory donations. Each family in the parish is asked to do its part to help us reach this goal. You will hear more about this program at Mass. Many have already received mailings detailing the plan. At Mass today each family will receive a “coupon” on which the family name and contact information will be written. After Mass you will be invited to trade the coupon for an information package. In this way we will be able to keep track of who has received the package so we will not have to mail out duplicates. At Mass the contents of the package will be discussed. No decisions are needed today—although a sample of the commitment card is included in the package. In two weeks we will have a gathering after the Sunday Mass to help explain CLT and to begin to accept your pledges. Again, Rosary has a reputation for showing the diocese we respond to challenges. Let’s do this once again!

FINANCES

Last weekend many Rosary members brought in Offertory donations to compensate for the Sunday(s) missed because of our wild weather. Still, only 43 envelopes were used. Many people, of course, just drop cash in the collection. Still, our records look better with a greater number of people using the envelopes. Our total last week was \$ 2439. This weekend the financial statements for 2013 are available. A suggestion: look at your statement and try to see a pattern to your donations. Are there a lot of blank spots without donations? Think about how you can become a consistent donor that we can depend on. Thanks to so many Rosary people who faithfully contribute week after week. The amount doesn’t matter as much as knowing you are “with us” in our ministry.
