## **TOGETHER IN FAITH UPDATE**

**For over five years, Rosary has heard about the Archdiocese's program Together in Faith (TIF), designed to prepare parishes for a situation where a pastor/priest would not be available. With the death of Fr. Morand over 15 months ago, Rosary's involvement with TIF took on new seriousness.**

**As you recall, our first impulse after realizing we could not continue as a "free-standing parish" was to reach out to our neighbors St. Aloysius and St. Patrick. Our choices were limited; virtually every nearby parish had already entered into some sort of merger/cluster arrangement. Similarities of missions of Rosary and St. Aloysius and St. Patrick made merger seem beneficial. We held several meetings and discussions, including a general parish meeting. We came to realize that merging with these two parishes would result in a new parish with a new name, new combined councils and new financial arrangements—sharing assets and debts. A situation arose in which St. Patrick and St. Aloysius decided to move ahead with a merger; Rosary could join later if we wanted.**

**In the mean time we explored other options including involvement with the Newman Ministry at Wayne State, working with Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, possible joint ventures with the seminary, etc. We explored use of our rectory/parish house by various other institutions. Time passed and options disappeared. St. Aloysius and St. Patrick became bogged down in working toward a merger.**

**On May 14, 2014, Archbishop Vigneron officially clustered Rosary with Blessed Sacrament Cathedral and St. Moses the Black Parish. Monsignor Michael LeFevre continues as Administrator of the three parishes.**

**Now, what does this mean for Rosary?**

- We will have a consistent availability of priests for Sunday worship. The Capuchins and Jesuits who have helped us for so long are moving on to other sites and duties. It has become almost impossible to get a "guest priest" on some weekends.**
- Fr. Gregory Deters has been appointed Associate Pastor to the cluster. This makes him, as well as Monsignor LeFevre, responsible for the two weekend Masses at Rosary, the two Sunday Masses at St. Moses and the Sunday Mass at Blessed Sacrament.**

- This arrangement of priests will actually be more economically beneficial to Rosary. We will pay 1/3 of the salary and benefits of the two priests. In the past year, we have been paying 1/3 of Monsignor's salary and expenses, but also paying the visiting priests a stipend for each Mass they covered.
- Rosary is still "a free standing parish" with its name, worship site, budget and resources.

So, what changes can we expect? The Parish Council meeting this week recommended and endorsed the proposal to move Sunday Mass time to 9:30 AM. If you remember, we did have 9:30 AM Mass for many years. Moving it to 9:30 will allow the priest who celebrates the 9:30 Mass to "zoom" up to the Cathedral to celebrate the 11 AM Mass there. Think about it: ½ earlier Mass start to enable this clustering arrangement to allow us to keep out church, our name, our finances, etc. This weekend there will be cards available for any comments or questions that should be answered.

Now we will be able to move forward without questions such as "Will we be here by the end of the year?" "Why should we make repairs when the whole parish might be closed?" We are facing the future with great optimism. We have a sound budget that provides for current expenses and for improvements. We have a dedicated, involved congregation, willing to support the parish as well as Catholic Services Appeal, Changing Lives Together, etc. We are working very hard for our 125 anniversary celebrations in September and October of this year. Let's move forward in many directions—evangelization, outreach, youth and adult religious education, increased membership.

We have survived for 125 years and, with God's help, are looking forward to the next 125!
