SALESIAN HIGH SCHOOL

As we announced last week, a group of Salesian High School alumni gathered here for a 50th anniversary Mass for the class of 1964. Several people raised questions about how Salesian fit in with Rosary. The vacant property on Harper was first the site of our church and rectory. When we moved to Woodward, our school was built on that land. The schools closed in 1950 as people began to move. The area became more “institutional”—warehouses, hospitals, nursing homes, Wayne State, etc. The Oblates of St. Francis de Sales opened Salesian High School in our school buildings in 1950 and remained until 1970. After this a theater group and a free school rented the buildings, which were finally torn down in 1979. The Salesian students gathered in Rosary church for weekly devotions. Having the Salesian alumni join us this weekend is really a way of touching our common history.
