HUMAN TRAFFICKING

The Christian Service department of the Archdiocese of Detroit has been involved with the problem of human trafficking. Human trafficking is defined as “a situation in which an individual is compelled to work or engage in commercial sex through the use of force, fraud or coercion; if the individual is under 18 years of age, force, fraud or coercion need not be present.” This is a world-wide problem. Here in Detroit, it is often overlooked or even ignored. The Christian Service department will be holding seminars to inform us of the existence and extent of the problem. Under the leadership of State Senator Judy Emmons, efforts are underway to establish “safe houses” for victims. A group, All Worthy of Love, is collecting donations for travel-sized personal care packages of wrapped food items, gift cards, etc. benefiting those enslaved by street prostitution. Suggestions would include granola bars, juice boxes, chips, shampoo, soap, tooth paste, deodorant, blankets, gift cards, etc. Should we, as a Parish, be more involved in this campaign?
