CSA

Three weeks into our 2105 Catholic Services Appeal campaign we have reached 70% of our goal of \$7,200. As of last Sunday, pledges and contributions totaled \$5,015. A Rosary History Mystery

There exists a photo taken in the old school gym showing a gathering of over 100 priests:



This is less than $\frac{1}{2}$ of the gathering. Obviously a meal has been completed. The candles have burned down. Dishes and silverware have been removed. There are half filled glasses--- prohibition??—cigars, etc. Focus on the center of the photo:



Bishop Michael Gallagher is in the center with the cross. To his right is Monsignor Van Antwerp, Rosary's founding pastor (the first in an illustrious line of Monsignori who have served Rosary!!!). Mystery—What was the occasion? Monsignor Van Antwerp is obviously elderly. Monsignor Van Antwerp died in 1930, just short of the 50th anniversary of ordination. Could this have been the 40th anniversary of Rosary—1929? Might this have been a celebration of the ending of a 40 Hours devotion? Maybe just a friendly get-together for most of the priests in the diocese? Any ideas?
