Tottings from Fr. J.J.

WHO ME?: As Catholics, we firmly believe that God has a plan for our lives! He calls some to marriage, but unfortunately in today's culture, we simply stop there in our understanding. God also calls some to the priesthood, and others to religious life, and still others to live as a generous single disciple. Fully living our own vocations and teaching young people how to discern God's call is a serious and joyful duty. This is National Vocations Awareness Week. During this time, I want to challenge you to first pray. Pray about how God is calling you to live your vocation more deeply: in your family, work place, and in our parish. Second, pray about the people in your life (children, grandchildren, students, friends, fellow parishioners) who may be open to God's call to serve in the priesthood or religious life. Third, call me with their name and number and I would be more than happy to discuss with them about discerning how God might be calling them. Don't forget: Vocations come from Communities. Wouldn't it be amazing to have them blossom from our own parish community?

ALL SAINTS DAY: Today we celebrate a solemnity also known as All Hallows day. As Catholics, we commemorate all those who have attained the beatific vision in Heaven. Tomorrow we celebrate All Souls' Day which specifically commemorates the departed faithful who have not yet reached Heaven. In our liturgical books it is called The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. As Catholics, we pray for the dead. This comes from the fundamental belief that there is a prayerful spiritual bond between those in heaven, the "Church triumphant", and the living, the "Church militant". Our prayers have an effect on them, and their prayers have an effect on us. We will see our loved ones again. It is our tradition that our loved ones who have died are recommended to the prayers of the parish community. As the church prays for them we also pray for those who mourn their dead; that they will be consoled by the hope of the resurrection in which we all believe. We are grateful for these traditions of the Church which give expression to our desire to share and lighten the burden of grief all of us sometimes bear. Special prayers offered for the deceased during the month of November is one such tradition.

I welcome you to come celebrate with us at the Cathedral on Nov. 7th at 11am for a Memorial Liturgy, with a remembrance of all who have been buried from O.L. of the Rosary, St. Moses the Black, and the Cathedral in the past year (as well as anyone you would like to have remembered). Grief is not pleasant, but grief without faith is horrendous. In the Eucharist we reconnect with our loved ones.

RCIA: I put this in last week's bulletin, but it is worth repeating. As Catholics, we are so very blessed!!!! Too often, though, we can take for granted what we have: Jesus. We need to share what we have been given. I need your help. There are folks that you know, but I do not, who would benefit from our parish/faith. We have something called the RCIA (The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) where adults experience what it means to be Catholic. So whack the bushes, give me the names of your co-workers, family, neighbors, and friends who need to be invited to our initial meeting. Send me their name and number (and your name too) so I can invite them to consider going deeper and maybe take a look at the Catholic Church. I am counting on you!

BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH

Fr. August Tolton is the only African American man in the process of canonization. Servant of God August Tolton was the first publicly known Roman Catholic priest in the U.S. when he was ordained in 1886. Due to issues of the day, Fr. Tolton had to go to Rome to study. His first assignment was at his home parish in Quincy, IL. He later was assigned to Chicago where he led the development and construction of St. Monica, a Black Catholic parish in Chicago. He remained in Chicago until his untimely death at 43.
