CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR GRADS: This weekend we honor the graduates from our Cluster. Whether they have graduated from Grade School, High School, College, or Graduate School, this is no small accomplishment. They have worked hard and deserve our praise. Congrats to you all.

I want to remind you though, it is not all about us and our accomplishments. Each of us has received God given gifts. St. Peter reminds us, “as each has received a gift,” we are to “use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God’s varied grace” (1 Peter 4:10). This needs to land on us with appropriate weight. God wants us to know that our gifts are not an accident of genetics and experience. He knew what He was doing when He made each of us and He has intentionally given us the gifts we have for a purpose, His purpose. In other words, we are on assignment from God. This is why Paul says, “Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him, and to which God has called him” (1 Corinthians 7:17).

Patrick arrives; August 15-19 is our Cluster Vacation Bible School; August 21 is our Cluster Mass/Picnic at Bell Isle; and be ready: we are going to have another joint retreat at the end of the summer to kick off the year. The date is to be determined.
